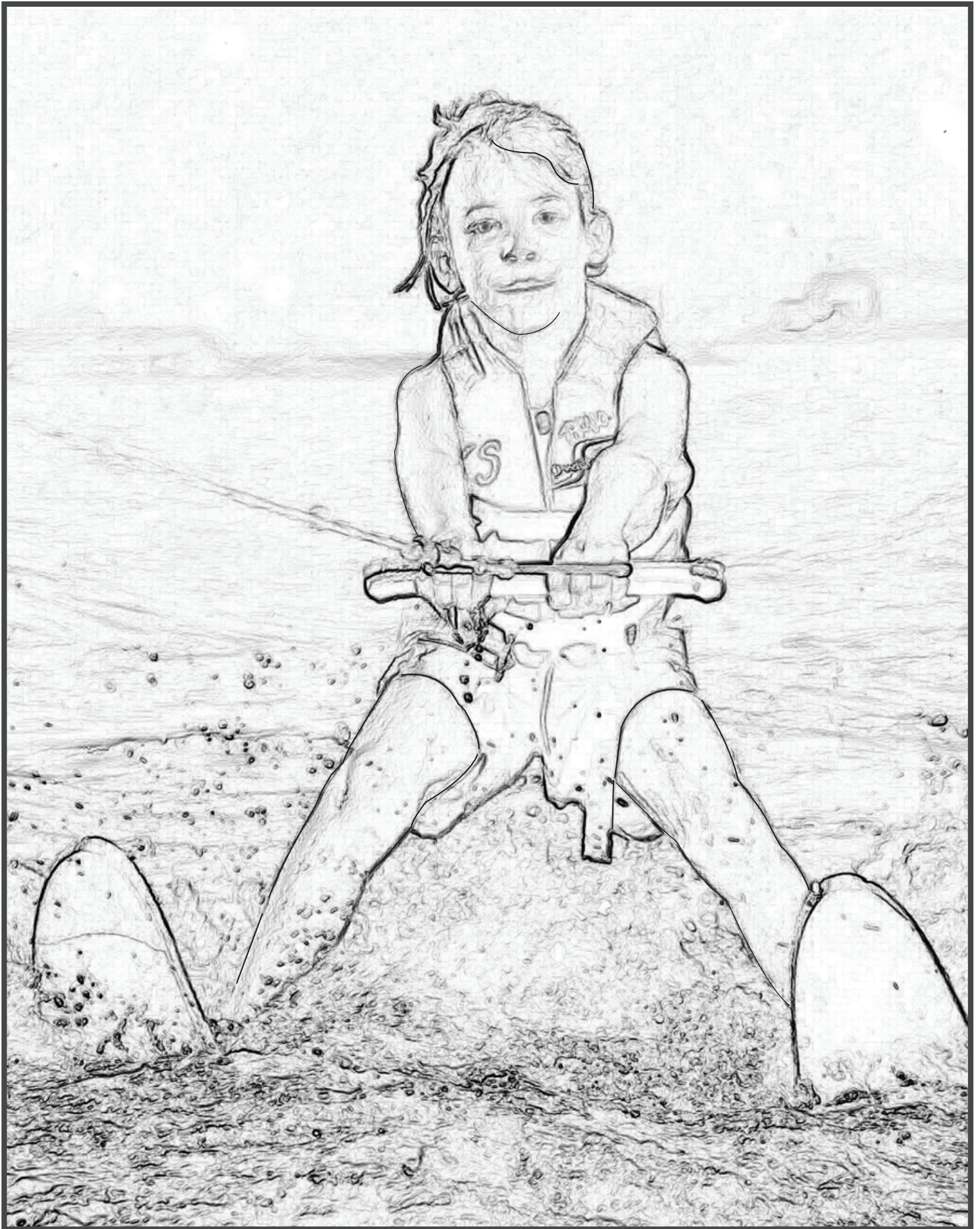




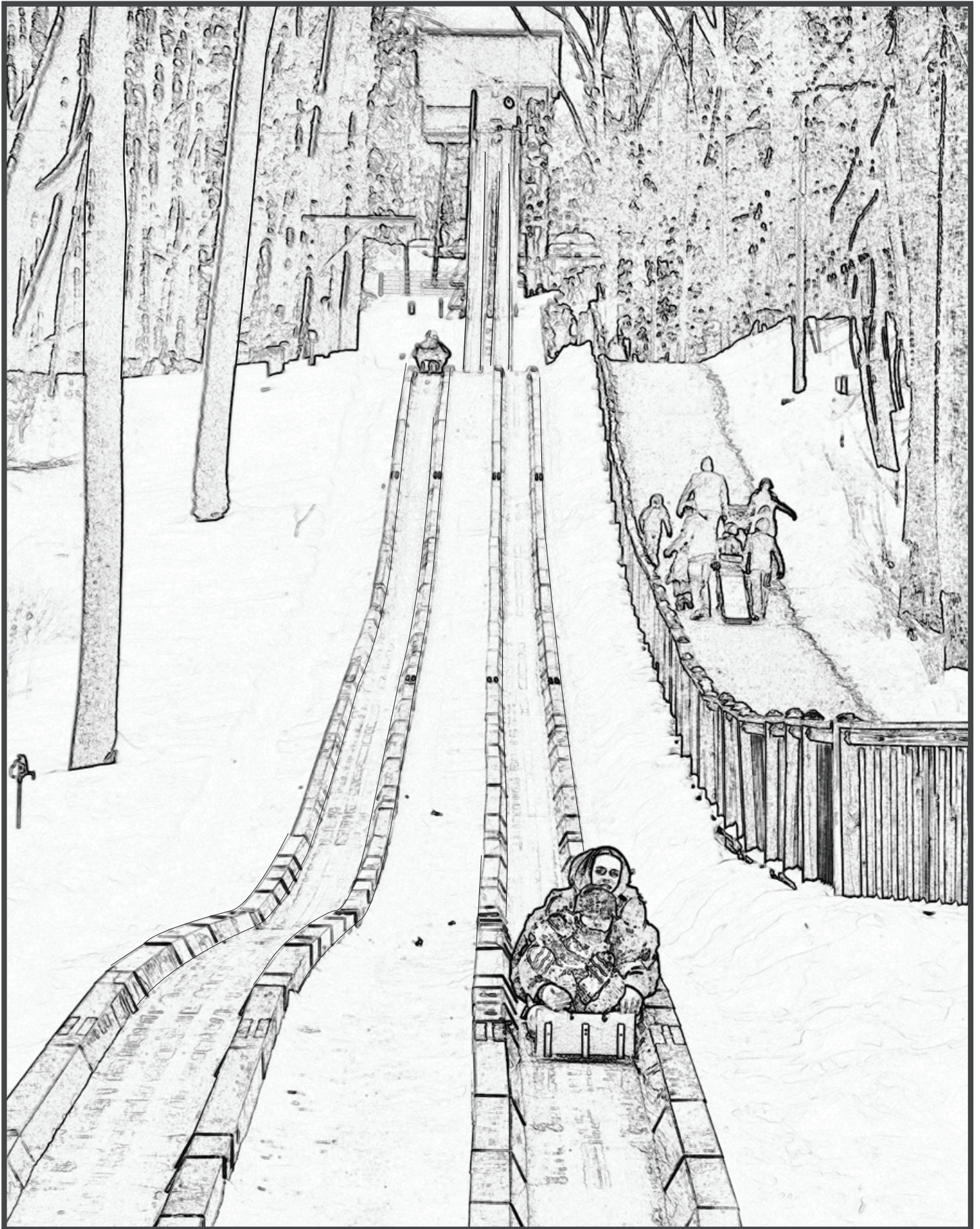
Known as the mound, the roundabout in downtown Angola is home to Lady Columbia. The monument commemorates the Civil War, and was built in 1917. There are plaques on the monument with the names of the 1,278 men from Steuben County who fought in the war.



Home of 101 lakes, Steuben County boasts a wide variety of fish, including bluegill, crappie, smallmouth and largemouth bass, northern pike, and many more.



Enjoy a variety of water activities including waterskiing, wakeboarding, tubing, wake surfing, kayaking, canoeing, jet skiing, fishing, boating and more.



Indiana's only refrigerated toboggan run is located at Pokagon State Park. You can go down the 1,780-foot dual-lane toboggan with or without snow!



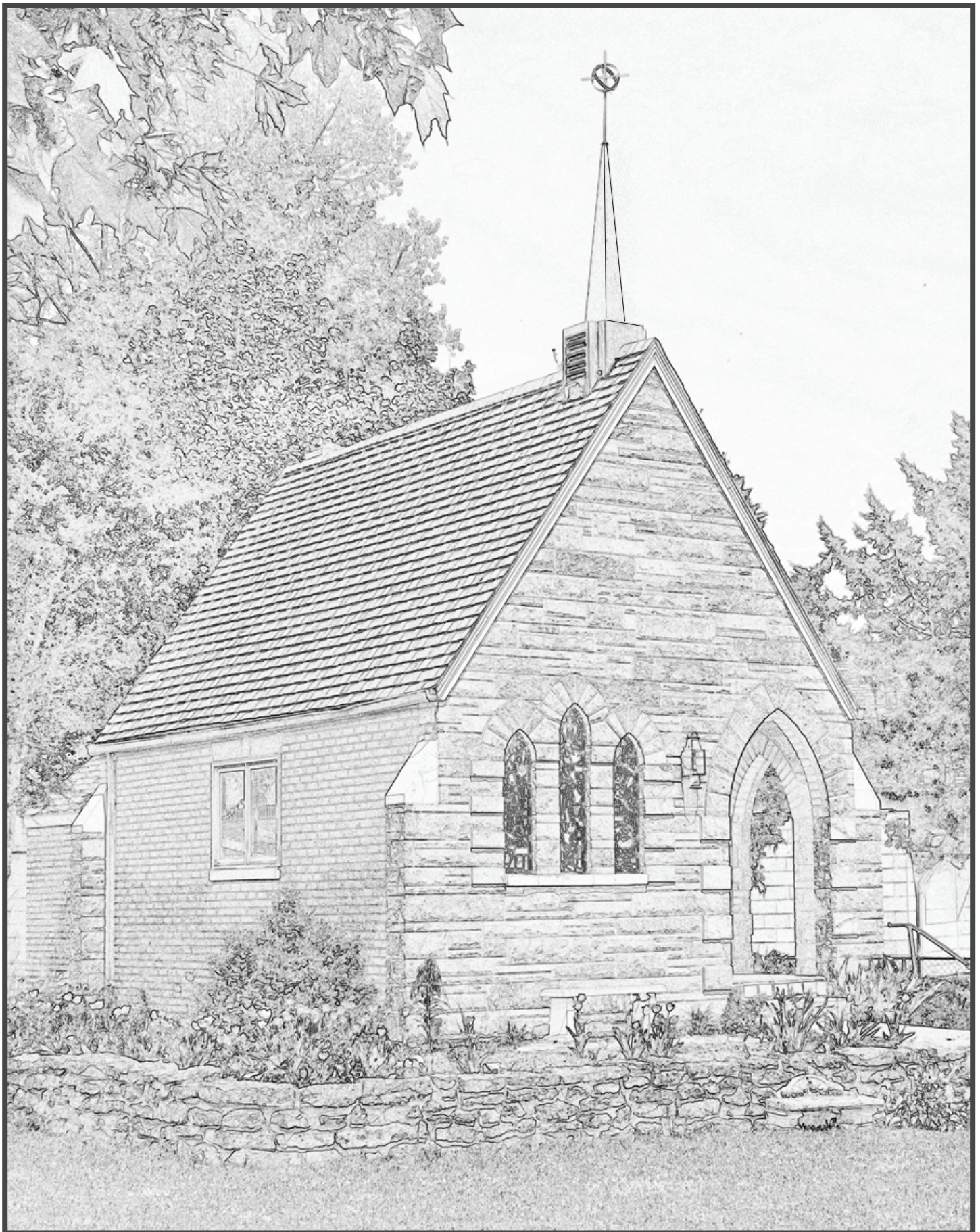

Simon Pokagon

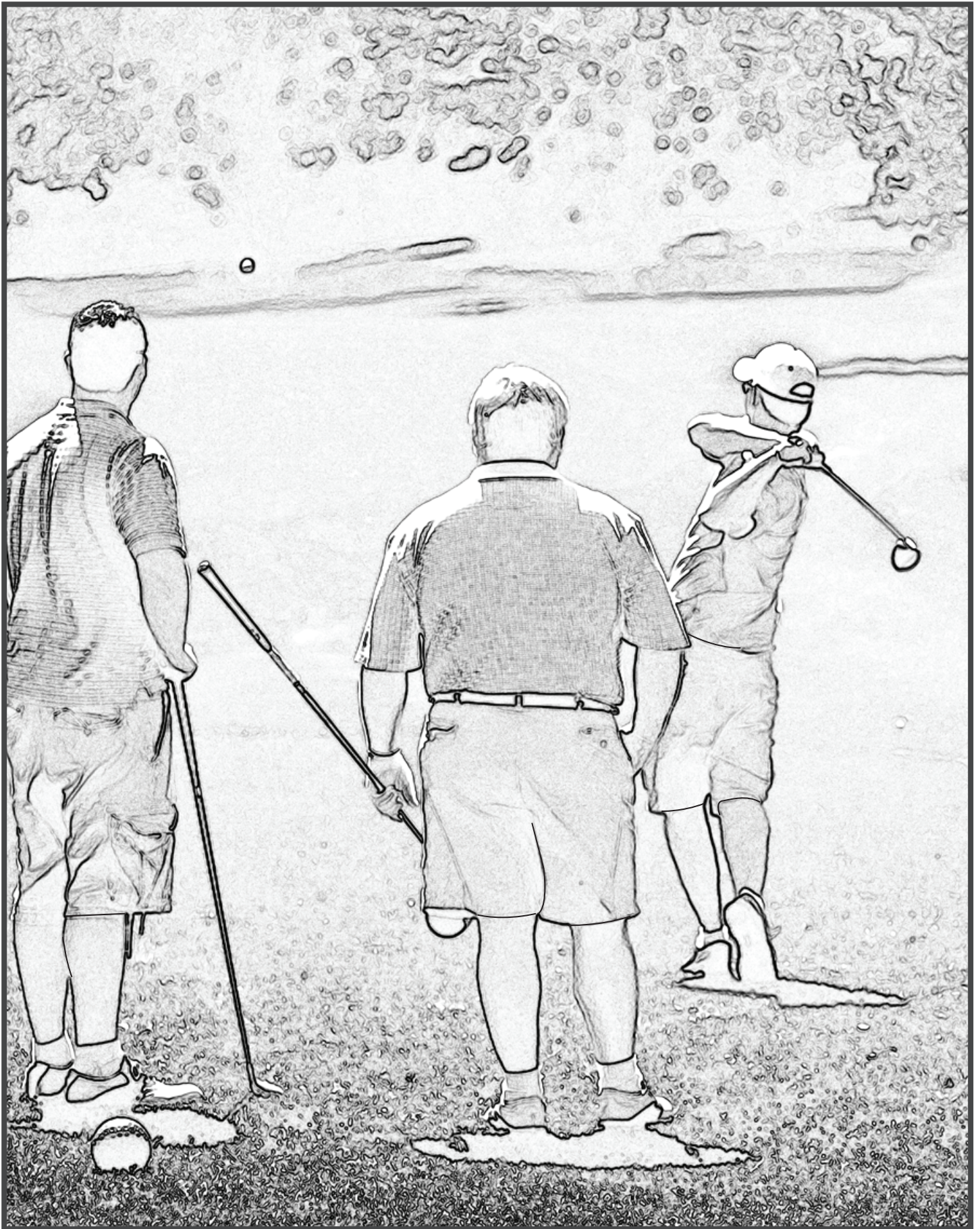
Leopold and Simon Pokagon were father and son and the last two notable leaders of the Potawatomi. Leopold was Chief of the Potawatomi from 1826 until his death in 1841, and Simon championed Native American causes until his passing in 1899.



There are a variety of restaurants in Steuben County. Many are locally owned and offer everything from Italian food to steak and seafood.



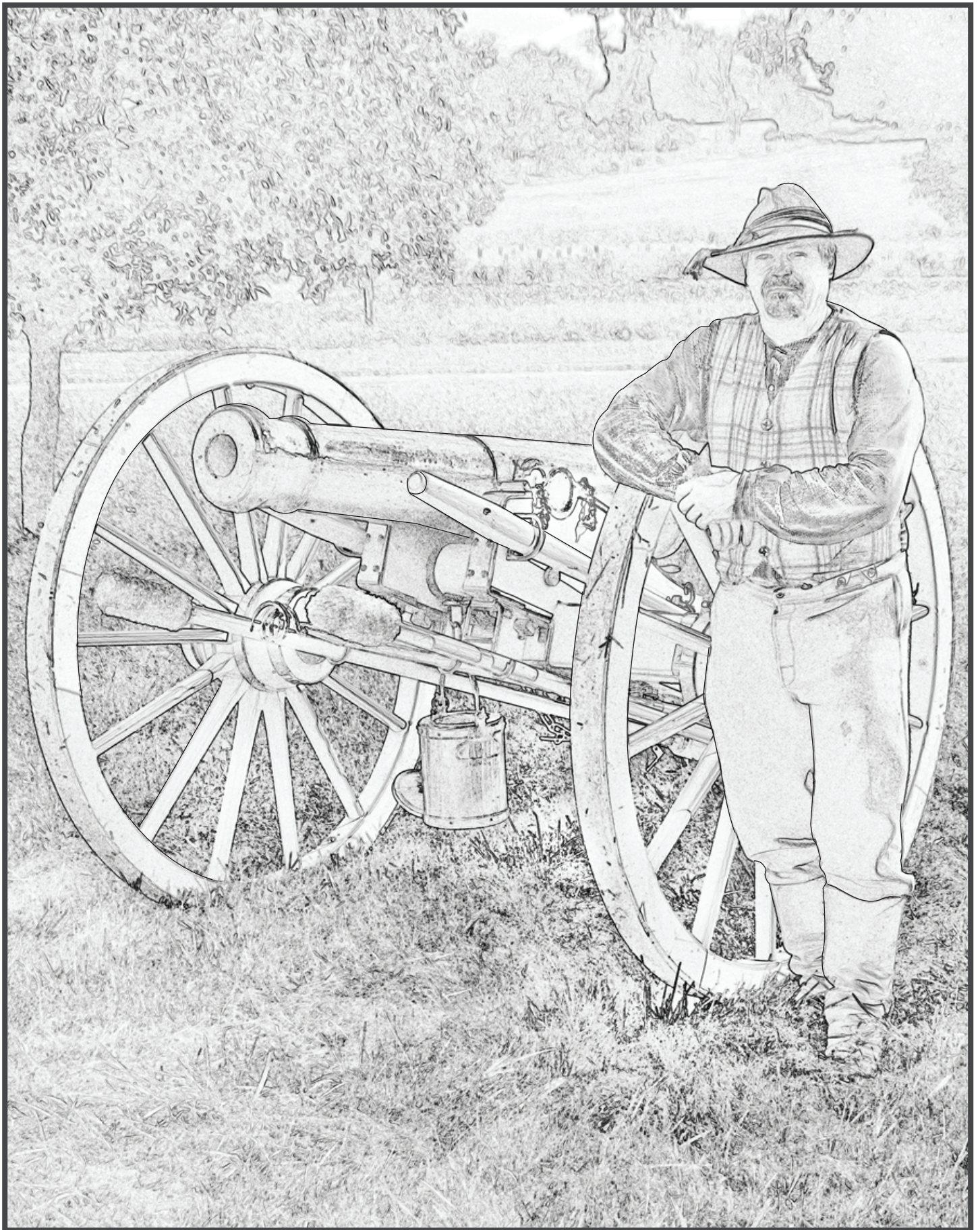
Located behind the First Congregational United Church of Christ, the wedding chapel was constructed in 1949. Steuben County became known as a 'marriage mill' because there was no waiting period for a marriage license.



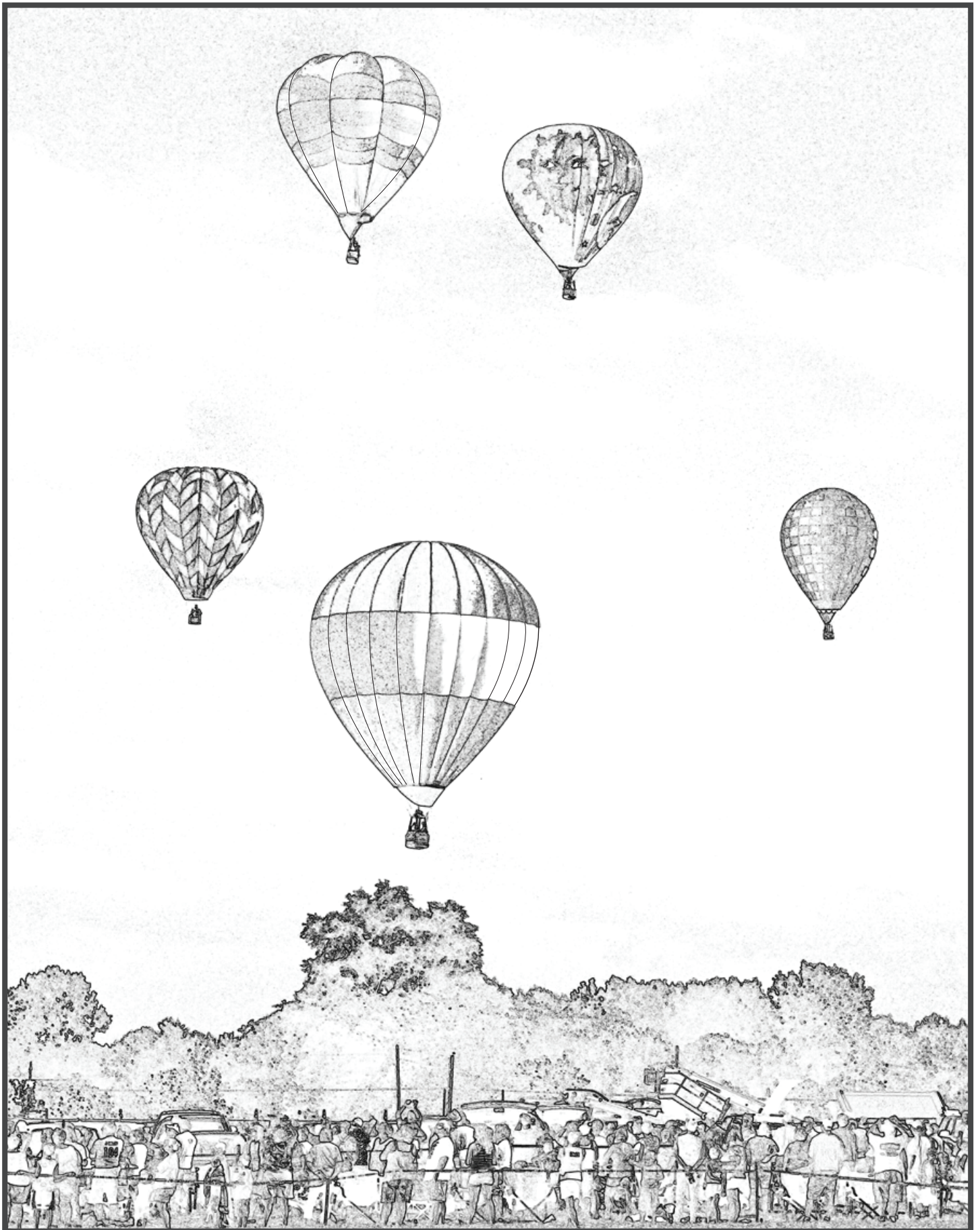
There are six golf courses in Steuben County that offer a variety of different terrains to play. You can schedule a round of golf any day of the week.



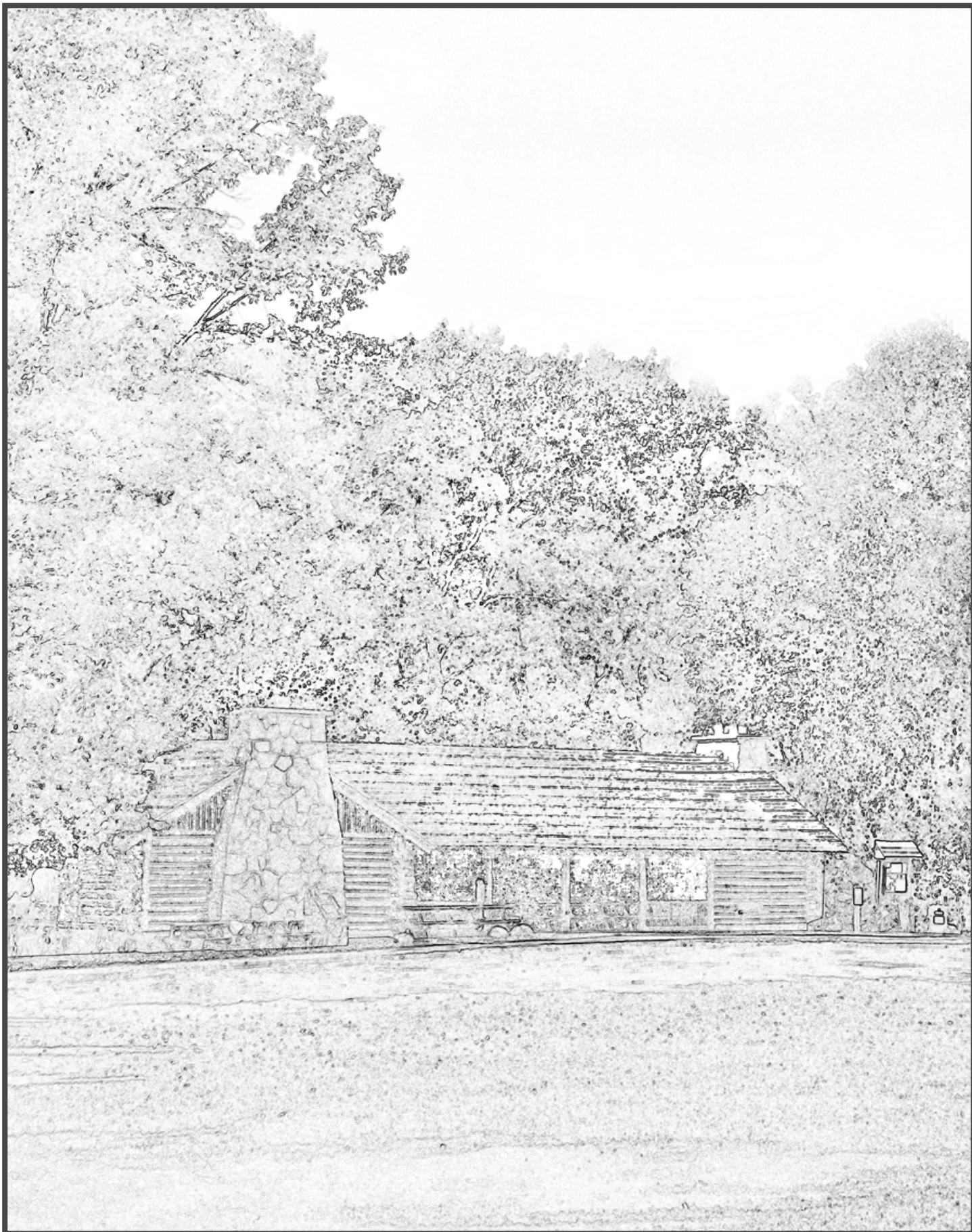
The state of Indiana turns 200 years old in 2016! The first state capital was in Corydon and less than 10 years later, the capital moved to Indianapolis.



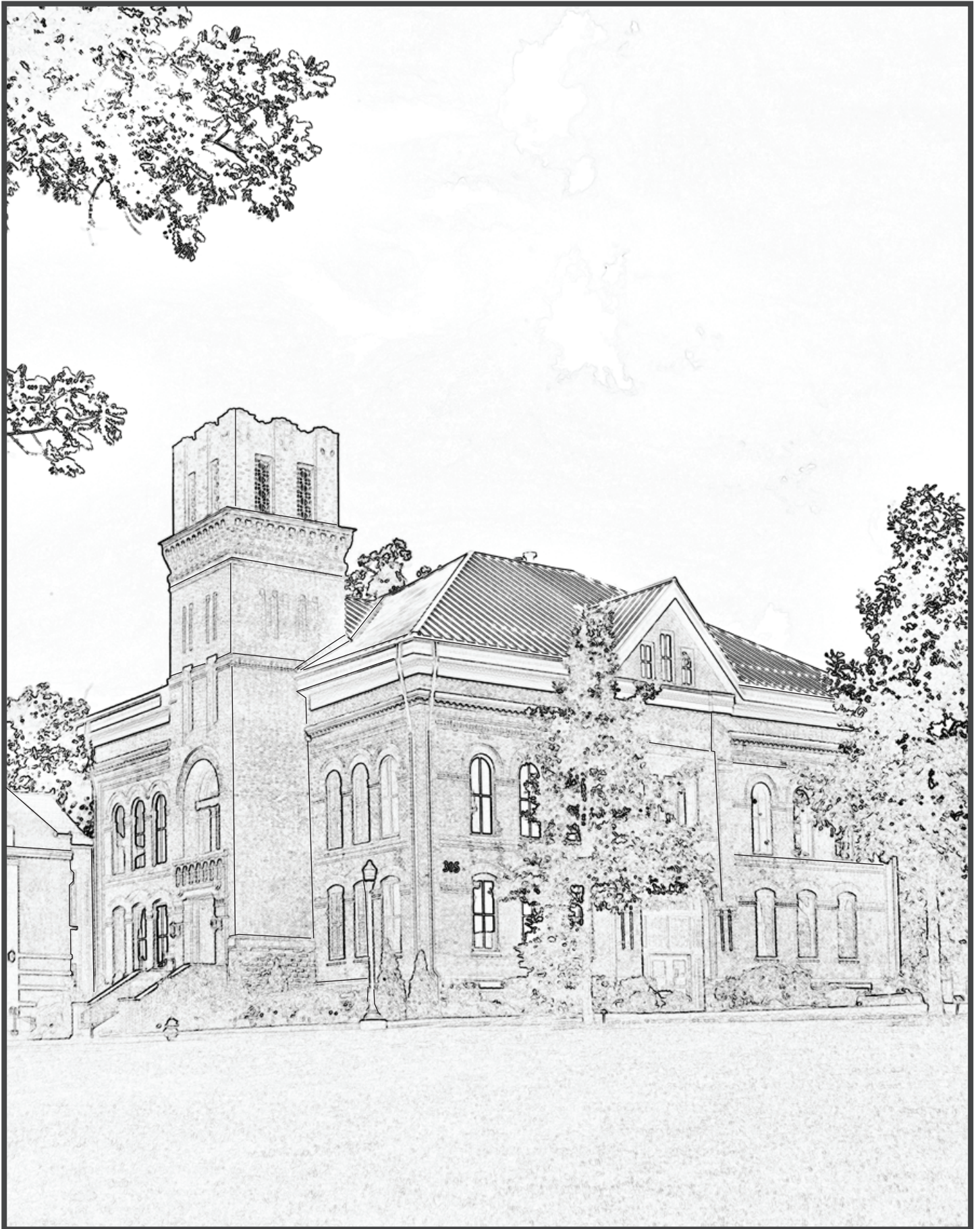
The Angola Civil War Days is a chance to experience the past firsthand in Angola in late September.



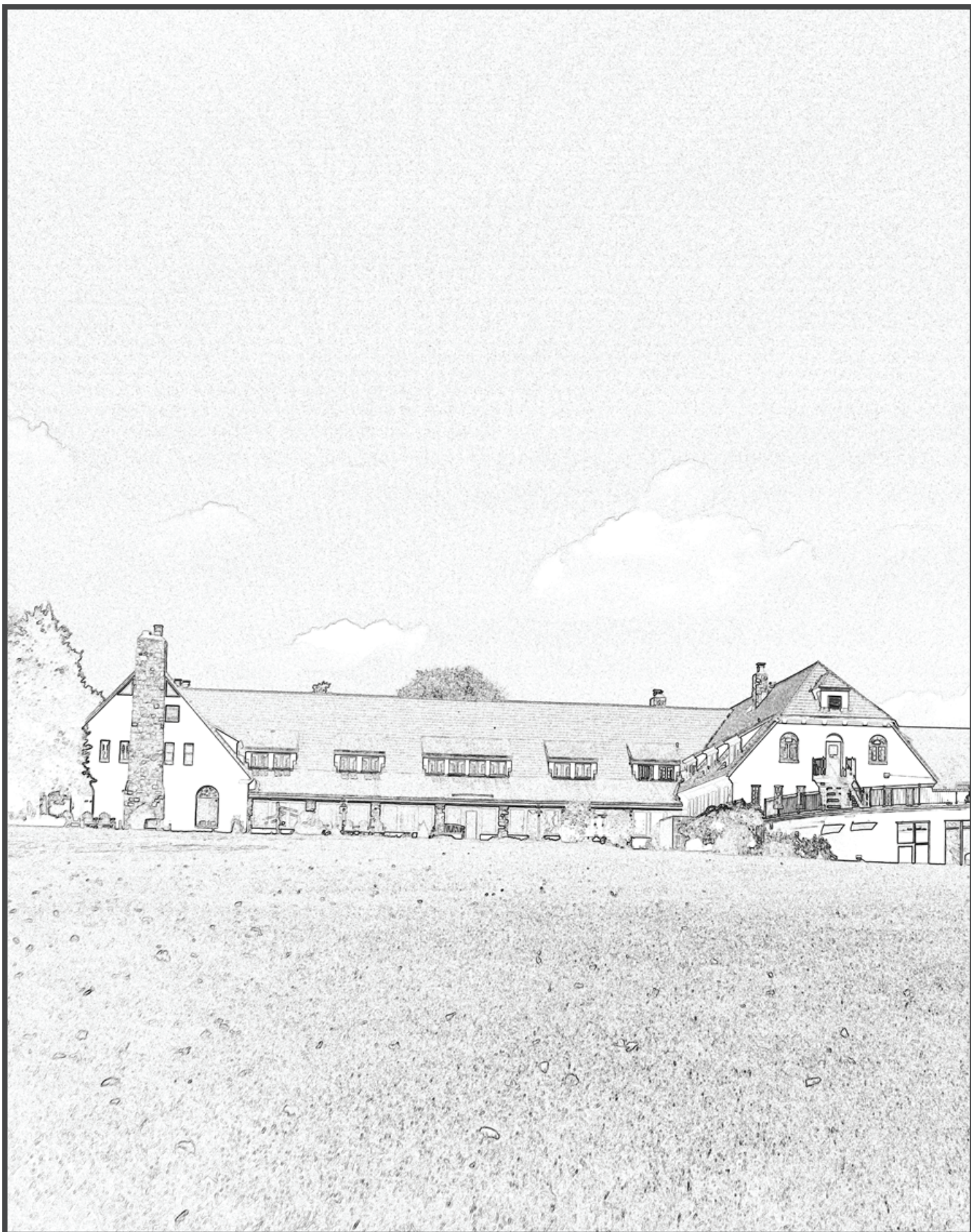
Angola Balloons Aloft brings in more than 35 balloon pilots from the Midwest for a two-day festival in July.



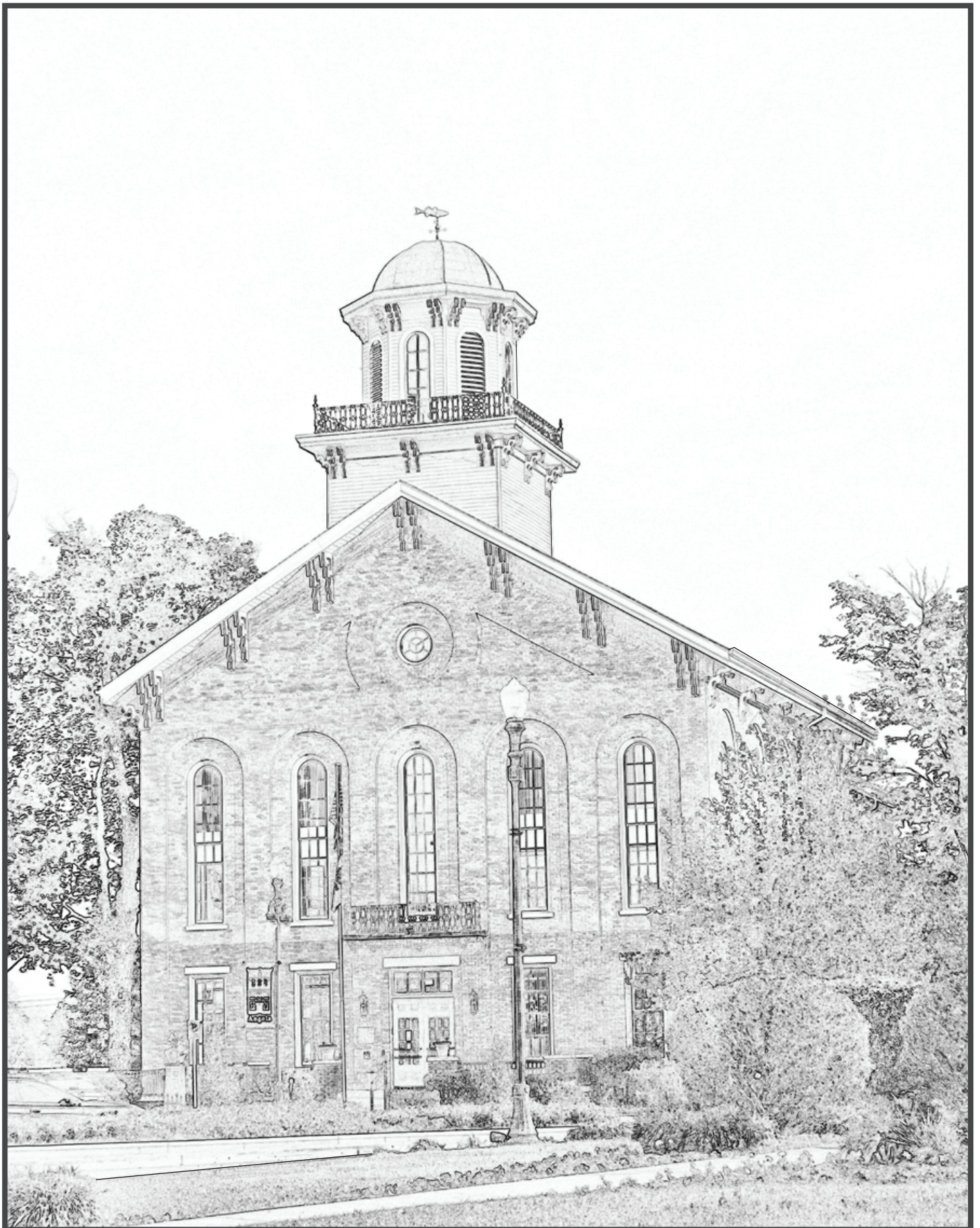
The Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC) Shelter at Pokagon State Park was built in 1936, and is listed on the National Historic Registry. It is one of several structures at the park built by the CCC.



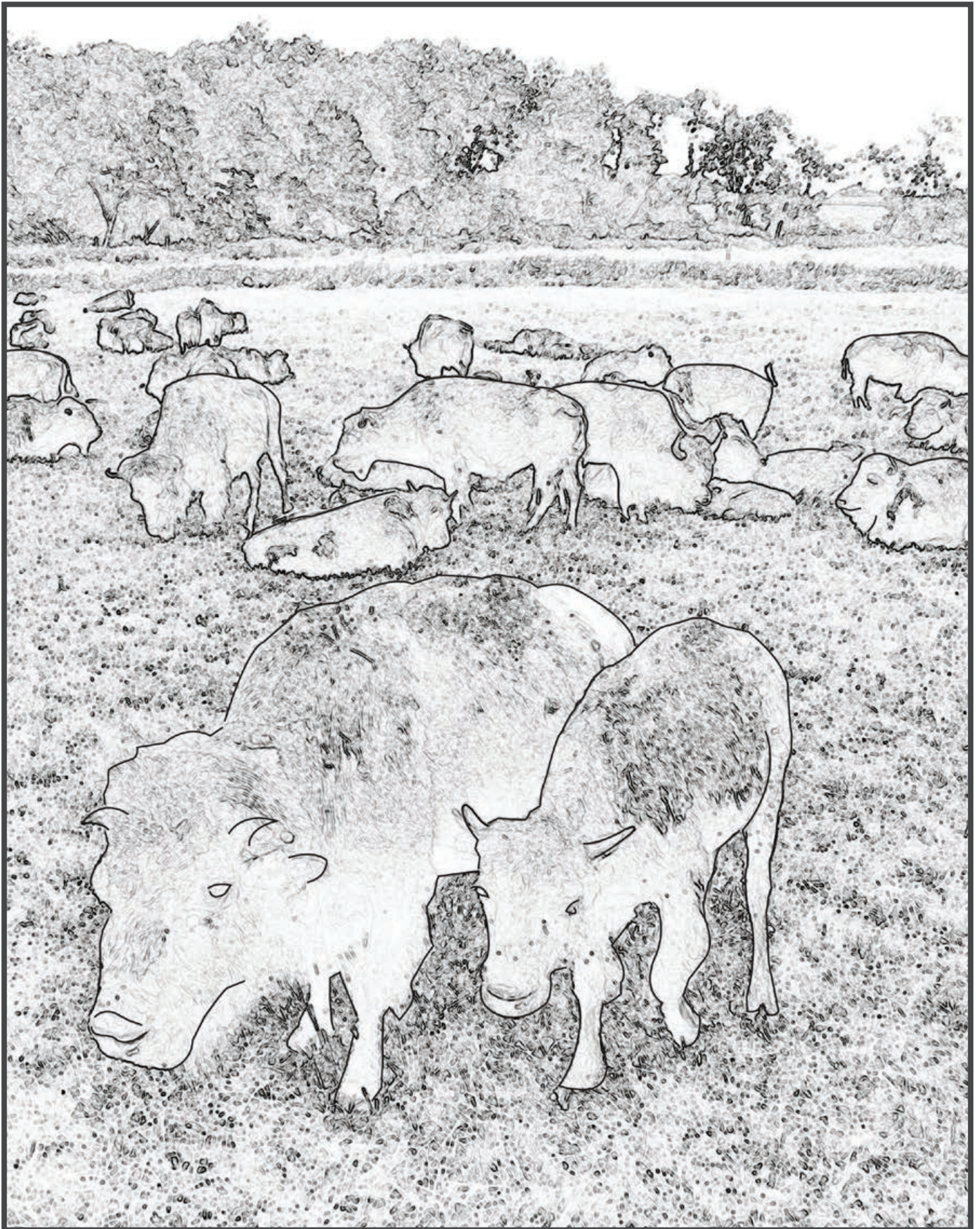
Trine University, formerly known as Tri-State University, was founded in 1884. Initially an engineering school, it now offers many majors, has over 1,700 students on campus, and has several satellite campuses.



Potawatomi Inn, built in 1928, is located at Pokagon State Park. It has been renovated and expanded several times since then, and now features an indoor swimming pool, conference center, full service restaurant, a large deck overlooking Lake James, and many other amenities.



The Steuben County Courthouse, located in downtown Angola, was built in 1868 and is listed in the National Register of Historic Places.



Wild Winds Buffalo Preserve is home to approximately 250 bison. Male bison can grow to be almost seven feet tall at the hump and over 2,000 pounds!
